george saunders comes along and brightens language up again takes it aside and gives it a pep talk sends it back renewed so it can do its job which is to wake us up best known for her inimitable short stories grace paley was also an enormously talented essayist and poet as well as a fierce activist she was a tireless member of the antiwar movement the civil rights movement the tenants rights movement the anti nuclear power movement and the women s pentagon action among other causes and proved herself to be a passionate citizen of each of her communities new york city and rural vermont
